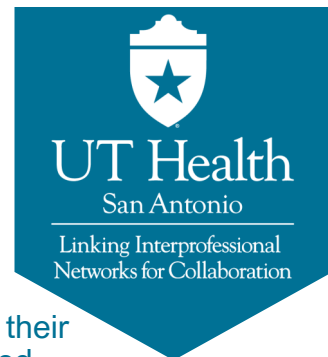


LINC IPE Faculty & Staff Development Program and Workshops

Co-Curricular IPE Track

Clinical IPE Track

Dr. Ratcliffe and his team will focus on IPE activities that take place in clinical settings as part of formal curricula (e.g., credit-bearing coursework).



Didactic IPE Track

October 21 and 28, 12:00-1:00 pm

Meredith Quinene, DHSc, MPAS, PA-C is an Associate Professor at the School of Health Professions who leads the LINC Faculty Council Didactic IPE Initiative. Dr. Quinene and her team will focus on IPE activities that take place in classroom or simulation settings (including online) as part of formal curricula (e.g., credit-bearing coursework).

Keith Krolick, PhD is a Professor at the Graduate School of the Biomedical Sciences who leads the LINC IPE Research & Scholarship Initiative.
